Sacred Heart Grammar School is a voluntary day grammar for girls aged 11 – 18. Established in 1930 by the Sisters of St. Clare, the school has maintained it's long established links with the Order and the Newry community.

The curriculum of Sacred Heart Grammar School is designed to promote the spiritual, moral, cultural, intellectual and physical development of the students, and to prepare them for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of adult life.

The Curriculum

Area Learning Community

Sacred Heart Grammar School is a member of Newry & Mourne Area Learning Community (ALC). Collaborating with 16 other local schools and learningproviders, the ALC strives to offer greater choice and flexibility for all post-primary learners aged 14 and above. Sacred Heart has in recent years extended its curriculum provision at GCE AS and A Level by collaborating with the Abbey Grammar School to offer students a broader curriculum so that they can choose a blend of courses which best meets their needs, aptitudes, aspirations and interests.

School Uniform

School regulations require every student to have a full school uniform. Students are encouraged to take pride in their uniform and their general appearance. The school uniform consists of:

The School Day

The school day begins with Assembly & Registration. Students are in school from 8.55 a.m. - 3:20pm. Registration also takes place in the afternoon.

The Dining Hall provides a variety of healthy choices for lunch or dinner and also accommodates those students who wish to bring a packed lunch. Breakfast is available in the Dining Hall from 8.15 - 8.55 a.m.

Pastoral Care

Sacred Heart Grammar School is committed not only to the intellectual development of students but also their personal and social development. An excellent Pastoral Care Programme, incorporating Personal, Social and Health Education, ensures that this goal is realised.

All staff members contribute to the delivery and development of pastoral care. Special attention is given to Year 8 students to help them settle into their new surroundings. In addition to the pastoral care provision by teaching staff, two members of the school's Student Support Team are available for individual counselling.

Role of the Form Teacher

A Form Teacher is assigned to each class from Years 8 -14 and meets the students as a Form Class group each day. Form Teachers monitor attendance, punctuality and academic progress. They also deal with any difficulties that a student may experience.

Role of the Year Head

The Year Head occupies a key role in the pastoral care programme. He/She works with the Principal, Vice Principal, Heads of Key Stage, Form Teachers, and other staff to encourage the personal and academic development of students and to actively promote the aims and objectives of the school within the year group. The Year Head who is assigned to each year group leads and supports the Form Teachers in their role.

Role of the Head of Key Stage

Four members of the school's Senior Leadership Team oversee Key Stages 3, 4 and 5. The Heads of Key Stage advise the Senior Leadership on all matters relating to their Key Stage. They develop a strategic vision for each Key Stage, lead and manage the various Pastoral Teams, ensure continuity and progression across the Key Stages and, primarily, they verify that the pastoral and academic needs of each and every student are met.

Role of the Vice Principals

The Pastoral Programme is coordinated by the Vice Principals. They lead the Safeguarding Team and are the Designated and Deputy Designated Teacher for Child Protection. Along with the Principal, they have overall responsibility for the pastoral care of staff & students and curriculum provision.

Positive Behaviour

Good behaviour creates the conditions for effective learning and helps to develop in students responsible attitudes and values for life. Teachers consistently encourage high standards of behaviour within the school and beyond, in the interest both of the student and society. There is an excellent relationship between students and teachers. Good order is maintained, not simply by a regime of sanctions and rewards, but by encouraging self-discipline. Teachers endeavour to create an environment where constructive and purposeful activity can take place. Full details of the School Rules can be found in the Student Planner.

Religious Education

All students in Years 8-12 attend timetabled Religious Education classes each week. In addition to the formal Pastoral Care Programme, Sacred Heart Grammar School provides opportunities for each student to grow in an appreciation of the Catholic faith and in the knowledge and love of God. Careers Education

Employability is incorporated into the Learning For Life and Work Programme for Years 8 – 11. Students from Years 12 –14 are timetabled for Careers Guidance and are also given specific guidance based upon personal interviews with their career guidance teacher. The work of Careers teachers is supplemented by the Careers Officer from the local Careers Service, who visits the school regularly.

The Careers Department offers the following opportunities for students:

- ·a variety of careers talks for different year groups, including visits and talks by representatives from the world of work, including the S.T.E.A.M. industries
- ·the opportunity to attend a UCAS Higher Education Convention

- ·Medical Debate.

Physical Education

Sacred Heart Grammar School provides an extensive range of sporting activities for students. All year groups, from Years 8 –12, have two periods of P.E. per week. Students in Years 13 & 14, assisted by P.E. staff, devise a Personal Exercise Plan for the school Fitness Suite.

The top quality facilities include a fully equipped Sports Hall and large modern Fitness Suite, an Assembly Hall equipped for gymnastics, changing areas and showers, two grass pitches, two all-weather pitches, four tennis courts and two netball courts.

Study Facilities and Reading Room

Sacred Heart is equipped with two study facilities - our Year 14 Centre and the Assisi Room. Each room is resourced with computer access, linked to a high quality printer/scanner/photocopier. The Assisi Room is available to students after 3:20pm for after school study.

The Mary Bell Reading Room has been recently refurbished to provide a quiet space for all pupils to borrow or read the range of fiction and non-fiction books available here. The encouragement of good reading habits and reading for leisure is still very much an aspect of our student development programme. Throughout the year various activities are held to promote literacy including a Book Fair, National Poetry Day celebrations, The Irish News Literacy Project, World Book Day celebrations, READON, invitations extended to guest authors and National Storytelling Week celebrations. All students are invited to participate in these events.



Music

Sacred Heart Grammar School has a strong tradition of extra-curricular musical activities. In addition to the Junior and Senior Orchestras, there are woodwind, string and brass ensembles, a jazz band and Irish traditional group, providing opportunities for students of all levels to perform music. Both orchestras and ensembles regularly perform at a wide range of events, including Open Night, Prizegiving, Concerts, and at the local Feis.

The Junior and Senior Choirs compete in local festivals and perform on many occasions throughout the year. The Senior Choir also participates in Ulster Youth Choir workshops.





Drama



The school has a thriving Drama
Department and students of all ages have
the opportunity to perform in a variety of
plays and compete in a range of festivals.
Years 8 – 10 have timetabled Drama class
each week, while GCSE Drama and A Level
Drama & Theatre Studies are popular
choices for senior students. In addition to the
practical work for examinations in Drama,
students have the opportunity to take part in
practical drama workshops led by visiting
theatre companies and to participate in
theatre visits and compete in drama
festivals.

The School Musical

Facilities

Situated on a beautifully landscaped 20-acre site, the school contains a Main Building, a purpose-built Design & Technology/Science Block, an Arts & Social Sciences Block and a Dining Area.

The facilities within the main building include an attractive Reception Area, Assembly Hall, Sports Hall and Fitness Suite, Counselling/Interview Rooms, Careers Suite, Oratory, Home Economics Rooms, Mary Bell Reading Room, The Assisi Room, Humanities Rooms, ICT network rooms, Science Labs, Reprographics and Staff Resource Areas.

The Arts & Social Sciences Block boasts a Drama Studio, Art and Music Rooms, several Music and Drama practice rooms as well as Social Sciences classrooms. The Design and Technology/Science Block offers superbly equipped ICT, Science and Technology facilities. Adjacent to this building is the Year 14 Centre. The spacious grounds contain grass and all-weather pitches, athletics facilities, tennis courts and netball courts. St Clare's Garden, opened in 2005 to mark the school's 75th Anniversary, is a tranquil and beautiful place within the school grounds where students can walk or sit during break and lunch time. It has recently been re-landscaped as part of the 90th celebrations.
